Cost, time in travel and available dates are being considered.</li> <li>• This Friday, 31 students will compete at the Catholic II Zones carnival at Chandler Aquatic Centre.</li> <li>• The Dance Program is underway, and we have had great participation and positive feedback from the students. We look forward to the Year level performances at the fete.</li> <li>• Angela Bromfield our Guidance Counsellor will present the Bullying NO Way message at assembly on Friday with our Year 5 and 6 students. 6B will lead assembly on Friday with a special Harmony Day presentation. Our Student Council are inviting all students at St Agnes to participate in a multi-cultural Free Dress Day for a gold-coin donation to celebrate Harmony Day (21 March) and raise money for Project Compassion.</li> <li>• This Saturday 17 March we will have an Open Day for new families. I thank the St Agnes families who have children in the band or choir who are giving up their time to perform on Saturday. Some of our student leaders will also speak to families and assist with school tours.</li> <li>• On Monday 19 March we will begin the week with a short liturgy in the undercover area to celebrate St Joseph's Day. It is an opportunity for us to remember our Josephite Charism and our connection to the Sisters of St Joseph who founded our school in 1962.</li> <li>• We are moving to a new company to do school photos this year, Kirby Studios. School photos will take place on 8 May. Kirby studios are also putting together a short video for St Agnes for our website, parent portal and to use on special occasions like Open Days. The video will be a collection of footage of a day at St Agnes. Filming for the video will take place in May.</li> <li>• At a recent Brisbane Catholic Education Leadership Cluster meeting the St Agnes leadership team engaged with a new strategic planning tool and the new School Improvement Framework. Planning is continuing with school staff to complete the 2018 to 2021 St strategic plan.</li> <li>• The refurbishment of the main toilet block including the boys, girls and disabled toilet is scheduled to be completed by the end of next week. 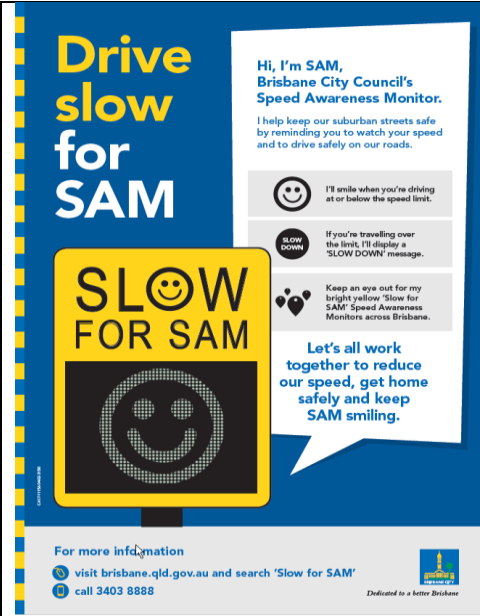

### **Bus Stop Accessibility Improvement Program Start of construction**

Construction of the Bus Stop Accessibility Improvement program is currently underway across Brisbane. The program is required to ensure all bus stops are compliant with the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the *Disability Standards for Accessible Public Transport 2002*.

**As part of this program, works are expected to take place near your property within the next three months, weather permitting, between the hours of 7am and 5pm, Monday to Saturday.**

For safety reasons some works may need to be undertaken at night when traffic and pedestrian volumes are lowest.

Works may include, but are not limited to, upgrades to boarding points, access paths, waiting areas, signage, tactile ground surface indicators and bus stop furniture.

Brisbane City Council will endeavour to keep this disturbance to a minimum where possible. We apologise in advance for any disruption caused and thank you for your patience while we complete this work.

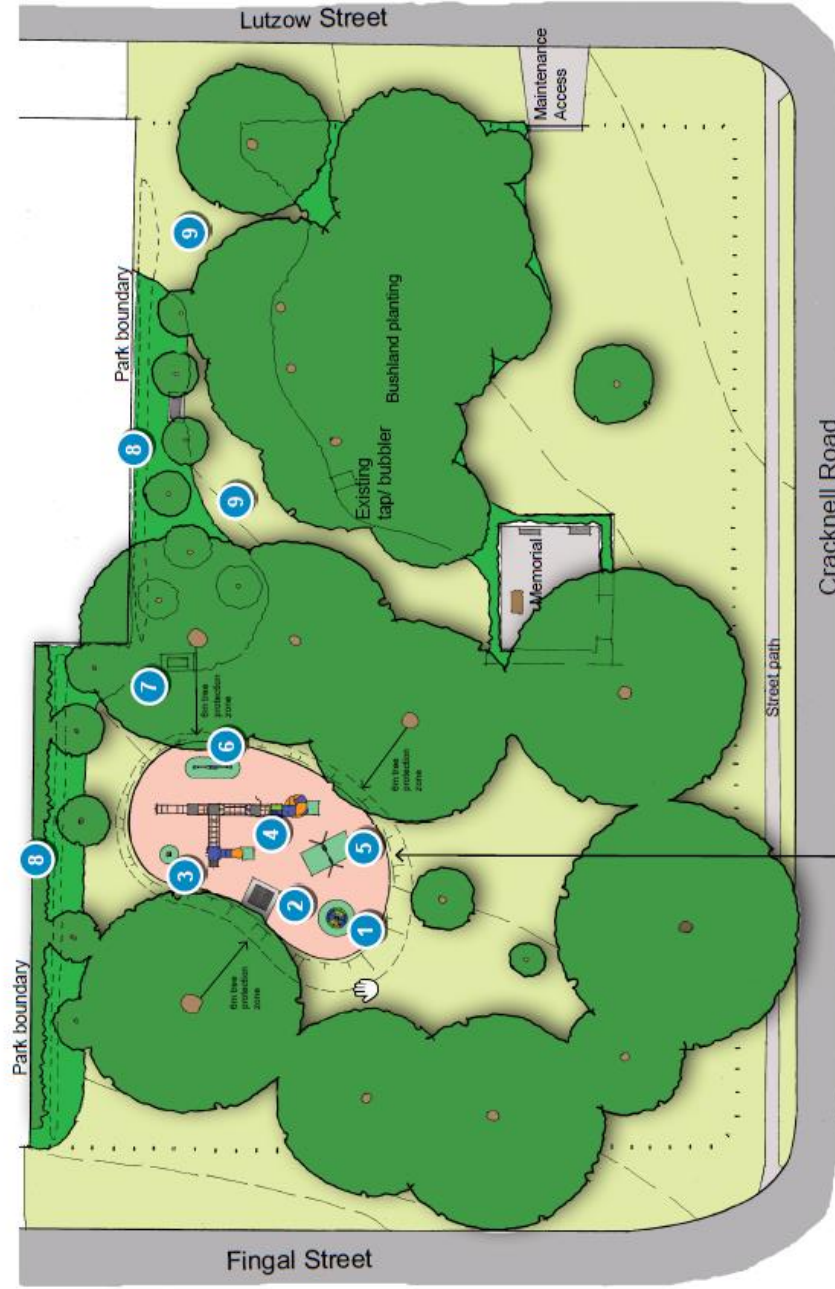
This program, which started in April 2015, aims to upgrade the bus stop network across Brisbane to provide improved accessibility for all public transport users. The works have been prioritised based on location, access to community and disability services, patronage and Council priorities.

The Bus Stop Accessibility Improvement Program is part of Council's *Brisbane Vision 2031* to provide a safe, accessible and well-connected city for everyone. The program aligns with Council's *Access and Inclusion Plan*, which aims to achieve universal inclusion of all residents and visitors to Brisbane.

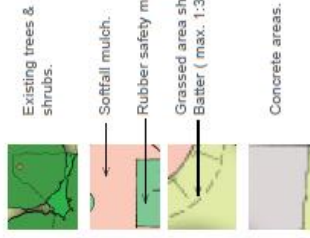

# EVENT AND ROAD CLOSURES

## Queen's Baton Relay – Holland Park

The Queen's Baton Relay (QBR) is occurring as part of the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games (GC2018). It's a Games tradition that celebrates the Commonwealth's diversity, inspires community pride and excites people about the world-class festival of sports and culture to come.

The Baton will pass through the Brisbane Local Government Area (LGA) on 30 March (Good Friday) and 31 March (Easter Saturday) 2018.

For the safety and security of the event, traffic management plans will be in place, with Queensland Police, State Emergency Services and Accredited Traffic Controllers implementing full road closures as the relay makes its way through the Brisbane LGA.

### For residents and businesses in Holland Park

Brisbane City Council, together with the Gold Coast 2018 Commonwealth Games Corporation (GOLDOC) wish to advise the QBR is planned to pass in the vicinity of your property on **Saturday 31 March 2018**.

As the Baton moves through your area, road closures are required to ensure the safety of the batonbearers and spectators. Vehicle access to and from your property is expected to be restricted for up to two hours, **from 12.30-2.30pm**, and some changes to parking arrangements will be implemented along the route.

Please note these times are subject to change, and are dependent on weather and operational activities on the day.

### Emergency vehicles

Emergency vehicle access will be maintained along the route should assistance be required. Access will be facilitated by local traffic control and managed through a dedicated operations centre in which all key agencies will be in attendance to facilitate any assistance required.

### Public transport

Road users and those requiring public transport are encouraged to plan ahead when travelling on these days, as services will be detoured and delays are to be expected.

On Saturday 31 March, Holman Street ferry terminal will be serviced by CityCat services from 9am-5pm. Additional limited stop services will occur at New Farm Park ferry terminal. These services will not be timetabled. Ferry services will otherwise remain unaffected. ### Street parking

Some temporary changes to on-street parking arrangements will be implemented along the QBR route. Areas affected will be signed up to 24 hours prior to the QBR occurring. Please take note of changes, as illegally parked vehicles may be relocated to enable the QBR convoy to pass through.

### For cyclists
